Stepping Stones

One of the greatest privileges our volunteers get is the opportunity to sit bedside vigil during a patient's final moments. At Bella Care Hospice we call this Stepping Stones. When someone is actively dying, our volunteers can be present to let them know they are cared for. This gift of presence can be a source of comfort for patients and their loved ones. Volunteers can offer families respite, for the chance to get a break during a long end of life process. They can also offer families emotional support and the chance to share stories at the bedside in their loved one's final moments. Volunteers can hold a patient's hands, offer comforting words and music, bring blankets, read, pray with a patient, and more. Many volunteers say this opportunity is a sacred experience and they are grateful for the opportunity to be part of someone's final hours. Recently, Dayton volunteer Deb was able to sit bedside and offer Reiki during Stepping Stones. She said she is always willing to help whenever she can because "It is an honor to be with them on their journey home." This year each of our branches is going to offer extra training to volunteers on sitting bedside vigil so that hopefully more volunteers will get the privilege of experiencing these sacred moments.


